

WOOF, among *Manufacturers*, the threads which the weavers shoot across, with an instrument called the *shuttle*, between the threads of the warp, to form the web.

The woof is of different matter, according to the piece to be wrought. In taffety, both woof and warp are filk. In mohairs, the woof is usually flax, and the warp filk. In fattins, the warp is frequently wool, and the woof filk.
