

**Dim'ity**, *n.* [Gr. *dis*, double, from *duo*, two, and *mitos*, a thread of the warp; L. Lat. *dimitum*; It. *dimito*.] A kind of cotton cloth of a thick texture, and generally striped, or otherwise ornamented in the loom; it is chiefly used for articles of female dress, and for bed-furniture and window-curtains, and is very rarely dyed.
